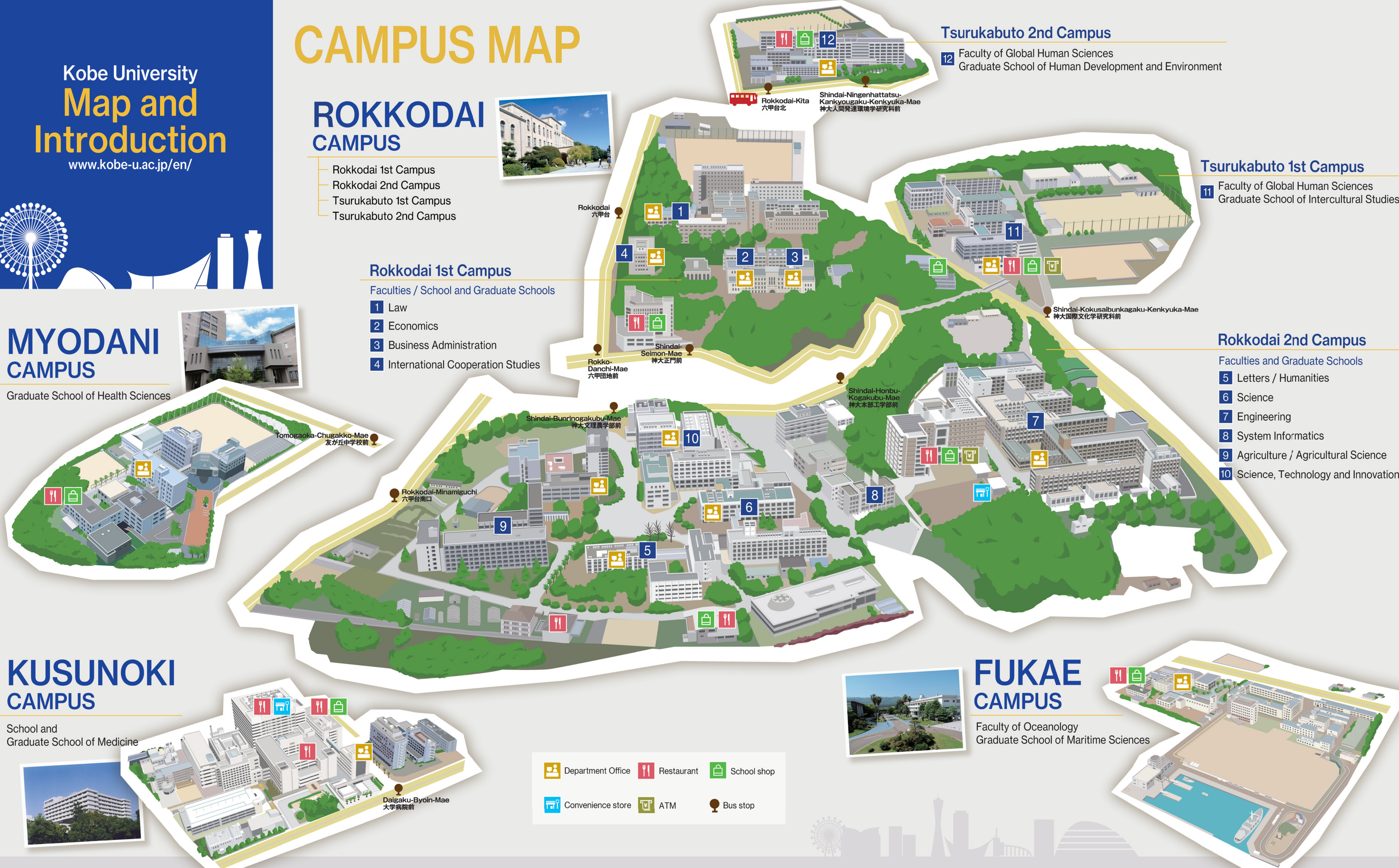

# Explore Kobe, Japan's cosmopolitan city of culture

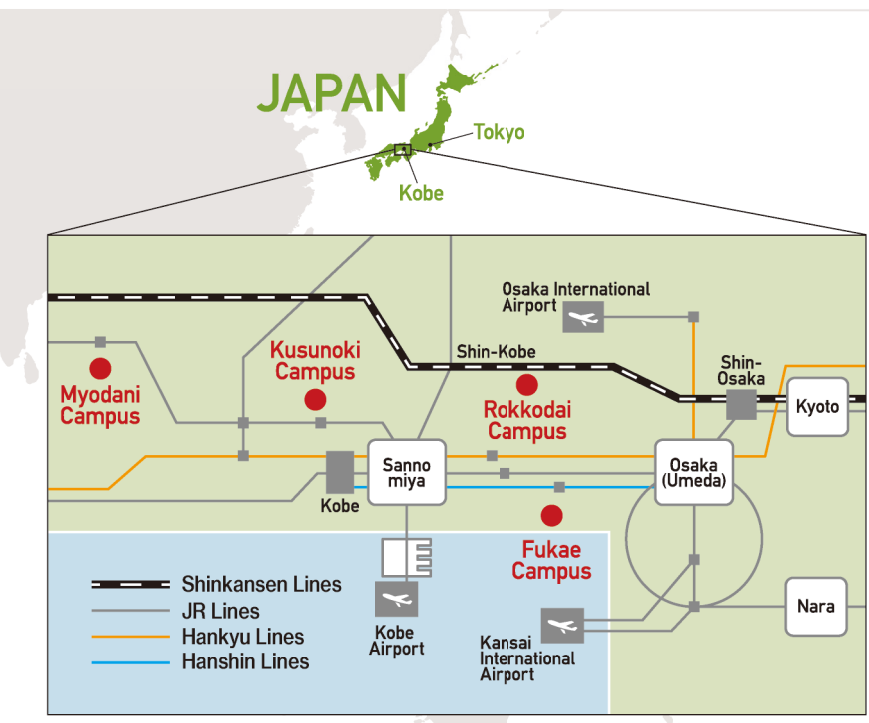
Located to the west of Meriken Park on the waterfront. Kobe Harborland is a shopping and entertainment zone with large commercial complexes including Mosaic. Overlooking iconic buildings such as Kobe Port Tower and the Maritime Museum, the area is especially popular among young people. It is connected to JR Kobe station via an underground passage.

As one of the most famous Chinatowns in Japan, Nankin-machi is a popular spot for tourists, especially during Lunar New Year and the Mid-Autumn Festival. You can browse the shops to find various unusual Chinese goods or enjoy Chinese food sold from street stands. The Chinese food in Nankin-machi is adjusted to Japanese tastes and is reasonably priced.

After the Port of Kobe was opened to foreign trade in 1868, the Kitano district to the north of Kobe City Hall was developed into a residential area for foreign merchants and diplomats. The 34 remaining mansions have been designated as a Group of Traditional Buildings and some are open to the public, including Weathercock House and Moegi House.

At the heart of Kobe City, Sannomiya is a lively downtown area home to many businesses, public buildings, department stores and cultural facilities. It serves as a regional transportation hub for the JR, Hanshin and Hankyu Railways, as well as Kobe municipal metro and Portliner.

Ikuta Shrine is one of the oldest shrines in the country and its founding is mentioned in the Nihon Shoki (the second oldest book of Japanese history). It is said to have been constructed by the Empress Jingu at the beginning of the 3rd century AD. Located in Sannomiya, the city center area of Kobe, the shrine is a popular location for young couples to pray for their happiness and to hold wedding ceremonies.

Oji Zoo

Oji Zoo, one of the three large zoos in the Kansai area, houses 800 animals from 130 species including many rare animals such as a giant panda, koala bears, Amur tigers, and snow leopards. Inside the zoo there is an Animal Science Pavilion, a small amusement park, and a display of an actual D51 steam locomotive on display.



Sake Breweries

Many famous Sake breweries are dotted along the coast of the Hanshin region in the five old districts called Nada Go-gou. Three of them (Nishi-gou, Uozaki-gou, Mikage-gou) are located in eastern Kobe. With 600 years of tradition brewing Sake, the area offers many exhibition rooms and the tools for producing Sake. Why not enjoy exploring the Sake breweries' traditional old buildings?



Rokko Mountains

The green backdrop to Kobe city is provided by the Rokko mountains, a mountain range roughly 56km long with the highest summit at about 1000m. The Rokko mountains are a popular sightseeing and hiking area, and you can enjoy beautiful scenery from the ropeways (Kobe Nunobiki Herb Gardens & Ropeway, Rokko-Arima Ropeway).



Supercomputer Fugaku

The supercomputer Fugaku was developed as a successor to the "K computer" with the aim of contributing to Japan's growth by solving social and scientific issues and achieving world-class results. Shared usage has been permitted since March 2021, and Kobe University researchers enjoy the privilege of access to this supercomputer for their research.
